Important Questions	Answers	Why this Matters:
What is the overall <u>deductible</u> ?	In-network: \$750 /member and \$1,500 /family Out-of-network: \$1,500 /member and \$3,000 /family	You must pay all the costs up to the deductible amount before this plan begins to pay for covered services you use. Your deductible is based on a calendar year and starts over each January 1 st . See the chart starting on page 2 for how much you pay for covered services after you meet the deductible . Unless a copay, fee or different percentage is shown, the coinsurance percentage of the allowed amount that you will pay for most services, after meeting any applicable deductible , is 20% in-network and 40% out of network. Copays, medications, access fees, balance bills, excluded services and precertification charges don't count toward deductible . In-network and out-of-network expenses cross accumulate.
Are there other <u>deductibles</u> for specific services?	No.	You don't have to meet deductibles for specific services, but see the chart starting on page 2 for other costs for services this plan covers.
Is there an <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> on my expenses?	Yes. Separate limits for in-network medical services and in-network pharmacy. In-network medical \$4,000 /member and \$8,000 /family In-network pharmacy: \$2,350 /member and \$4,700 / family Out-of-network medical: \$6,500 /member and \$13,000 /family Out-of-network pharmacy: \$0 /member and \$0 /family	The out-of-pocket limit is the most you could pay during a calendar year for your share of the cost of covered services. This limit helps you plan for health care expenses.
What is not included in the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> ?	Premiums, precertification charges, balance bills, and costs for health care this plan doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the out-of-pocket limit. You must keep paying them even if you reach your out-of-pocket limit. Also, your cost share payments for medical expenses do not count toward the pharmacy limit. Your cost share payments for pharmacy expenses do not count toward the limit for medical services.

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Does this plan use a network of providers?	Yes. See www.azblue.com or call 928-526-7211 or 855-845-1875 for a list of in-network providers.	If you use an in-network doctor or other health care provider, this plan will pay some or all of the costs of covered services. Be aware, your in-network doctor or hospital may use an out-of-network provider for some services. See the chart starting on page 2 for how this plan pays different kinds of providers.
Do I need a referral to see a <u>specialist</u>?	No. You don't need a referral to see a <u>specialist</u> .	You can see the <u>specialist</u> you choose without permission from this plan.
Are there services this plan doesn't cover?	Yes.	Some of the services this plan doesn't cover are listed on page 5. See your benefit book for more information about <u>excluded services</u> .

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- **Copays** are fixed dollar amounts (for example, \$15) you pay for covered health care, usually when you receive the service.
 - **Coinsurance** is *your* share of the costs of a covered service, calculated as a percent of the **allowed amount** for the service. For example, if the plan's **allowed amount** for an overnight hospital stay is \$1,000, your **coinsurance** payment of 20% would be \$200. This may change if you haven't met your **deductible**.
 - The amount the plan pays for covered services is based on the **allowed amount**. If an out-of-network **provider** charges more than the **allowed amount**, you may have to pay the difference. For example, if an out-of-network hospital charges \$1,500 for an overnight stay and the **allowed amount** is \$1,000, you may have to pay the \$500 difference. (This is called **balance billing**.)
 - This plan encourages you to use **in-network providers** by charging you a lower cost-share for their services. A noncontracted provider can charge full billed charges, and the plan will reimburse you based only on the plan **allowed amount**, minus your cost share.

Your Rights to Continue Coverage:

If you lose coverage under the plan, then, depending upon the circumstances, Federal and State laws may provide protections that allow you to keep health coverage. Any such rights may be limited in duration and will require you to pay a **premium**, which may be significantly higher than the premium you pay while covered under the plan. Other limitations on your rights to continue coverage may also apply.

Does this Coverage Provide Minimum Essential Coverage?

The Affordable Care Act requires most people to have health care coverage that qualifies as “minimum essential coverage.” This plan or policy does provide minimum essential coverage.

Does this Coverage Meet the Minimum Value Standard?

The Affordable Care Act establishes a minimum value standard of benefits of a health plan. The minimum value standard is 60% (actuarial value). This health coverage does meet the minimum value standard for the benefits it provides.

This example shows the cost share for a policy covering only one person. If the policy covers a spouse and/or children, a member's cost share may be less than the amount shown if other members contribute to or satisfy the family deductible before the Plan receives claims for that one member.

Questions and answers about the Coverage Examples:

What are some of the assumptions behind the Coverage Examples?

- Costs don't include **premiums**.
- Sample care costs are based on national averages supplied by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, and aren't specific to a particular geographic area or health plan.
- The Patient's condition was not an excluded or preexisting condition.
- All services and treatments started and ended in the same coverage period.
- There are no other medical expenses for any member covered under this plan.
- Out-of-pocket expenses are based only on treating the condition in the example.
- The patient received all care from in-network **providers**. If the patient had received care from out-of-network **providers**, costs would have been higher.

What does a Coverage Example show?

For each treatment situation, the Coverage Example helps you see how **deductibles**, **copayments**, and **coinsurance** can add up. It also helps you see what expenses might be left up to you to pay because the service or treatment isn't covered or payment is limited.

Does the Coverage Example predict my own care needs?

- ✗ **No.** Treatments shown are just examples. The care you would receive for this condition could be different based on your doctor's advice, your age, how serious your condition is, and many other factors.

Does the Coverage Example predict my future expenses?

- ✗ **No.** Coverage Examples are **not** cost estimators. You can't use the examples to estimate costs for an actual condition. They are for comparative purposes only. Your own costs will be different depending on the care you receive, the prices your **providers** charge, and the reimbursement your health plan allows.

Can I use Coverage Examples to compare plans?

- ✓ **Yes.** When you look at the Summary of Benefits and Coverage for other plans, you'll find the same Coverage Examples. When you compare plans, check the "Patient Pays" box in each example. The smaller that number, the more coverage the plan provides.

Are there other costs I should consider when comparing plans?

- ✓ **Yes.** An important cost is the **premium** you pay. Generally, the lower your **premium**, the more you'll pay in out-of-pocket costs, such as **copayments**, **deductibles**, and **coinsurance**. You should also consider contributions to accounts such as health savings accounts (HSAs), flexible spending arrangements (FSAs) or health reimbursement accounts (HRAs) that help you pay out-of-pocket expenses.

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
